RVTD Rollista/Silent

While this Cha position is called "Silent", your job on the weekend is far from what this word usually means. You are to interact with the Candidates at your table just like the Speaking Rollista. You are to assist the Speaking Rollista with keeping the Candidates on the topic of the Rollo. You will most likely need to volunteer some of the time to help draw the posters. You are not expected to be artists so do not hesitate to do this.

When the Rollista is NOT at the table, you are the one in charge. Please be sensitive to the Candidates and let them do most of the talking. However, if no one is discussing the Rollo, then please gets the ball rolling. Table discussions are Essential and it also lets you know if the Candidates are understanding the Rollos.

You do not have to act afraid or unsure like some of the Candidates will. If they see you taking the lead, they will feel more comfortable and less apprehensive.

Please be aware if a Candidate is having a hard time, in pain, confused, shy, resistive, and or acting out for the sake of attention. Your job is it to try and help this Candidate but you also can discreetly write a message to the Prayer Team to be in prayer for this Candidate by name. You should also inform the Table Cha and they will let the Head Cha know.

At times, a Candidate may become very emotional. It is perfectly fine for you to put your arm around them if you feel they would receive it, and try to console them. Ask them if they would like to speak with a Spiritual Director. It is not your job to counsel the Candidate, but just to act as a brother/sister in Christ and offer your shoulder to lean on. This will also encourage others at your table to do the same. This is what helps to bring your Table together and make it one unit.

It is important that you attend the team meetings and hear the Rollos. Your job is key in being an assistant to the speaking Rollista that you will be teamed up with. Your job is so important to work in conjunction with the Rollista to help promote unity at your Table. Do it with a heart of excellence as unto the Lord!
